In the event of a disaster, dental and medical practices must be in a position to **safeguard their patients' records** and be able to make sure that **those records can be accessed for the patients' continuation of care**. Most practices acknowledge this need but **few have taken the steps to be prepared for disasters**. HIPAA and OSHA have laws that mandate the implementation of such plans.
